Davis, one of the shrewdest young photographers around, took many of his best new pictures while in Italy during his Rome Prize fellowship year. But when he shows them alongside photographs made in China and in the U.S., in this exhibition titled "The New Antiquity," he scatters our attention too widely, as the scale jumps from huge to small and excellent pictures compete with others that are merely quirky. Still, there are images here that should not be missed, including a pair of bodacious Roman prostitutes, a graffiti-scarred wall painting, a gaggle of digital cameras displaying shots of the Colosseum, and a "Gypsy meal" of fried chicken and grapes spread out on a grimy mattress.
